I can now report on the New Years Party. It was a complete Success. We had about 70 in attendance, the steaks were great (thanks to Worshipful David Epps),


the baked potatoes were

Greetings! I hope you all enjoyed your start of the year and are getting ready for the upcoming events at the lodge. This month I would talk about participation in the Lodge.



Lastly, as we step into the new year, I would like to share a delightful recipe to start your mornings with a touch of sweetness. Try these fluffy and delicious pancakes that are sure to bring joy to your breakfast table:

Master

Classic Fluffy Pancakes:

#### Ingredients:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
  - 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 tablespoon baking powder

- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup milk
- 1 large egg
- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

#### Instructions:

- In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, sugar, baking powder, and salt.
- In a separate bowl, combine the milk, egg, melted butter, and vanilla extract.
- Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients and gently stir until just combined. Be careful not to overmix; it's okay if there are a few lumps.
- Heat a griddle or non-stick skillet over medium heat. Lightly grease with butter or cooking spray.
- Pour 1/4 cup of batter onto the griddle for each pancake. Cook until bubbles form on the surface, then flip and cook until the other side is golden brown.
- Repeat until all the batter is used.
